GOVERNOR OTTER PROCLAIMS APRIL "FINANCIAL LITERACY MONTH"

IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND OTHERS OFFER MONEY SKILLS COURSE

Boise, Idaho . . . Noting that "understanding basic personal finance concepts is now more important than ever", Governor C.L. "Butch" Otter today signed a proclamation establishing April as "Financial Literacy Month."

"Whether you have just started your first job, or you've just retired from your last job, knowing how to manage the financial assets you have is essential," Governor Otter said. "And with the many 'plain English' resources available today, anyone can become financially literate. I encourage every Idahoan to take advantage of the great free resources the State and others have available to learn about the wise use of credit, and the basics of saving and investing."

The Idaho Department of Finance, the Kootenai County Financial Literacy Task Force, and the Idaho Financial Literacy Coalition (IFLC), an affiliate of the Jump\$tart Coalition for Personal Financial Literacy, have joined together to sponsor "Financial Literacy Month" again in April. The IFLC is a partnership of private and public sector financial educators with whom the Kootenai County Financial Literacy Task Force is affiliated. The Department of Finance participates year round in the efforts of the IFLC and is proud to take part in this opportunity to draw attention to the need for all Idahoans to obtain basic money management skills.

The Governor signed the proclamation earlier today at a press conference sponsored by IFLC. Other events planned for Financial Literacy Month:
