ARIZONA PROMOTER AND ISSUER SUED FOR SECURITIES VIOLATIONS

The Idaho Department of Finance has filed a civil lawsuit in Ada County's Fourth District Court against Performance Realty Management, LLC ("PRM"), an Arizona company, and its principal, Sean Zarinegar ("Zarinegar"), a.k.a. Sean Zar. The suit alleges that PRM and Zarinegar violated anti-fraud provisions of State securities law in connection with the offer and sale of PRM's limited liability company units and raised approximately \$500,000 from at least one Idaho investor.

According to the complaint, the State alleges that PRM and Mr. Zarinegar defrauded at least one Idaho investor by a) failing to disclose that Mr. Zarinegar had been sanctioned by the states of Kansas, Illinois and Alabama for securities law violations, b) diverting investor funds to Zarinegar's personal use without specifically disclosing that use to at least one Idaho investor, and c) failing to disclose that one Idaho investor's investment interest would be converted from an investment in a real estate company that made its income from owning and managing real estate, to a company growing and selling hemp and marijuana.

The lawsuit also names five other defendants who are alleged to have received or have control over assets or proceeds associated with Mr. Zarinegar's and PRM's activities. Also named are Premium Performance Group, LLC; CBA Capital, Inc.; Corix Bioscience, Inc.; Koriz, LLC, and Kori Zarinegar, Mr. Zarinegar's wife.

The Department seeks approximately \$500,000 in investor restitution and \$40,000 in civil penalties, while also asking the court for restrictions on Zarinegar's future business dealings in Idaho.
