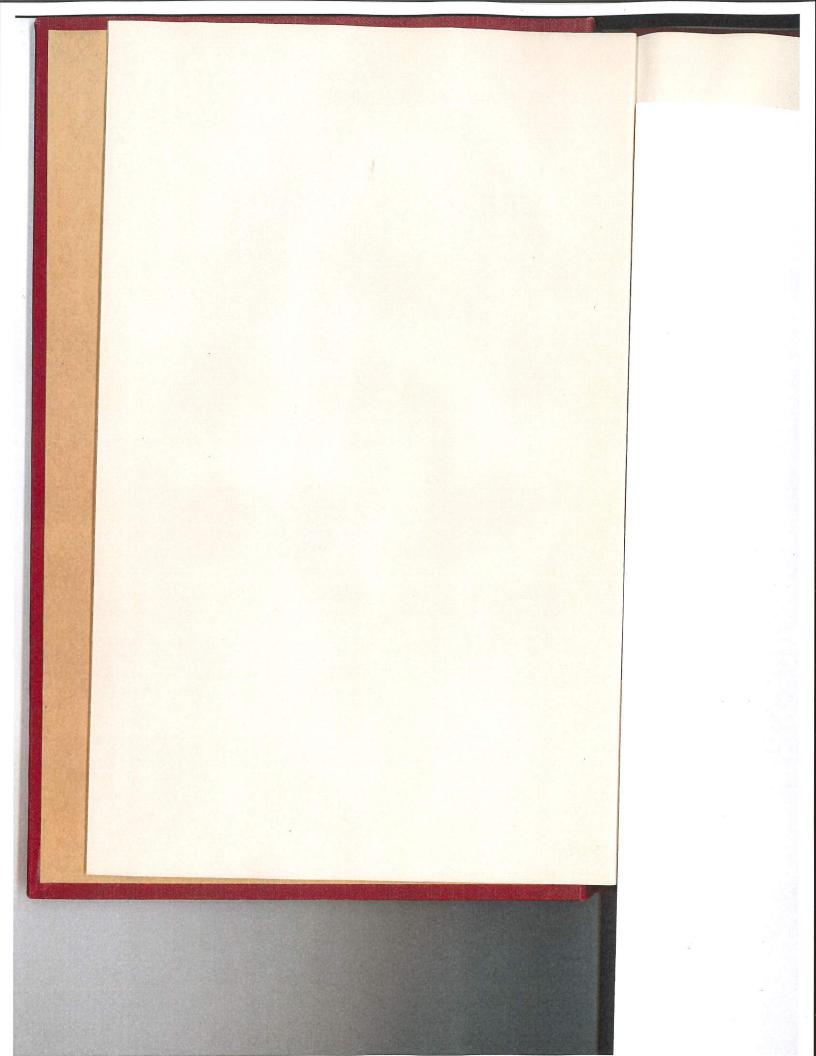

HIS EXCELLENCY, D. W. DAVIS, Governor, State of Idaho, Boise, Idaho.

SIR:

Agreeable to Section 5206, Chapter 205, 1919 Compiled Laws of Idaho, it is my pleasure to herewith submit for your consideration my report for the year ending December 31, 1919, which contains the following schedules, to-wit:

1. Comparative Statement.

2. Receipts and expenditures for the year and biennial appropriation.

3. Banks chartered, nationalized, increasing capital stock, changing name, and banks consolidated.

4. List of State Banks members of the Federal Reserve System.

5. Reports of condition of 137 banks and trust companies as shown by call report under date of November 17, 1919.

During the year five reports were asked for and made to this Department, on the same dates reports were made by national banks to the Comptroller of the Currency, namely, March 4, May 12, June 30, September 12, November 17.

During the year four state banks were organized and authorized to do business by this Department. There was one consolidation and three banks were nationalized. Two hundred sixty examinations were made; for these services fees were collected amounting to \$13,076.00.

Deposits of state banks have increased \$16,295,652.00, which is a gain of 39.41 per cent. This is the largest increase in deposits in the history of the State. The farming communities have enjoyed good crops and exceptionally high prices for their produce and grain. The condition of the lumbering and mining industries of the State has greatly improved. A number of mills which have been closed for the past year have resumed operations and in a number of cases have enlarged their plants.

Individual deposits show an increase of \$10,799,043.95, or a gain of 38.27 per cent. Savings deposits and time certificates of deposit have increased \$4,612,277.54, or a gain of 44.8 per cent. There seems to be a general movement with the public, which is especially true of the farmers and merchants, to pay obligations and invest surplus money in Liberty Bonds, and only in a few sections of the State is there a heavy demand for money. Loans generally are being curtailed and reserve balances increased. A great many banks have entirely eliminated their rediscount lines and are reinvesting in Liberty Bonds or paper which can readily be realized upon.

Cash and Due from Banks shows a gain of 51 per cent. Bonds and Warrants have increased 41 per cent, while the proportion of Loans and Discounts to the total deposits show a decrease of 9 per cent and obligations representing borrowed money a decrease of 27.4 per cent.

During the year fifty-four applications to organize new banks were received and of this number only five received favorable consideration. Refusal to grant charters was for various reasons. In some instances investigation showed that the organization was for purposes of satisfying the personal differences of the applicants or to advance the interests of some promoter, but in most cases charters were refused for the reason that the field was already sufficiently served and the business was too limited for the establishing of another bank in the community.

It has been the experience of the Department that one successfully managed bank in a community can serve the public to better advantage and with greater

safety to its depositors than where the business is divided between two or more smaller institutions, thus making the business unprofitable for all of them. The wisdom of such a conservative policy in granting charters is exemplified in the fact that it has been more than six years since a state bank has failed in Idaho.

The policies and organization of this Department under my predecessor, Mr. G. R. Hitt, was brought up to a very high standard. I have endeavored to follow his policies and trust my efforts have not been in vain, and that the high standard of this Department will be maintained.

I desire to thank the bankers of the State for their hearty cooperation and encouragement, and for the disposition manifested to comply in every respect with the requirements of the banking laws of the State of Idaho.
